

I grew up in a musical household and started piano lessons around the age of six. Music is a universal language that expresses emotion and experience that is sometimes beyond our words and language. Different musical techniques can elicit different emotions.

In Chord progression, the one that always makes my hair stand on end is the 7 chord—it is a dissonant chord in that the sound isn't quite right…its more than that…its grating, somehow hitting every last strained nerve in your mind and body. We get musical relief from this dissonant tension when the chord resolves. It's almost as if you can breathe again and you feel your body and mind relax.

I have always thought that the dissonance and resolution in music is such an apt metaphor for life. When we don't find resolution to the dissonance of life, we are on edge, tense, strained.

This Sunday is the second in Advent and the Sunday when we light a candle for and focus on peace. Whenever we focus on peace or talk about, it feels like its just so out of reach. We are fed news and examples of the absence of peace All.The.Time. And peace feels impossible...like why even bother?

And then I thought: "that's bullsh\*" Because while I cannot make all the dissonance of the world resolve, I have quite a bit of agency in my own life and my own

little corner of the world. Peace is a choice. God empowers us to live lives of peace, but we have to choose it. We have to choose to find resolution to the dissonance in our own lives—to make peace with trouble pasts, to forgive (and forgiveness doesn't always mean reconciliation, but it means you stop drinking the poison of regret and anger and expecting someone else to die), to stop listening to messages that demonize and make enemies of others, to seek truth, to ground ourselves in God and not in the pursuit of power and things.

We can choose peace.

I always will remember our visit to the Taize Community in France. John and I were blessed to spend to time there in 2012 when I was on Sabbatical and thanks to the generosity of the Lily Foundation's Clergy Renewal Grant. At the Taize Community they pray three times a day and you live very simply in community while you are there. And foundational belief is that *peace in the world begins with peace in the heart*.

You have to make the choice to resolve the dissonance in your heart, mind and soul. God holds out a hand to you this Advent...may we take it and choose to enter the work of peace in our lives.




