"And as he sat at dinner in the house, many taxcollectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, 'Why does your teacher eat with tax-collectors and sinners?' But when he heard this, he said, 'Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners.'" -Matthew 9:10-12

There is a case to be made for empathy. Empathy is defined as "being aware of and sharing another person's feelings, experiences, and emotions." I want to invite you to think on the word "aware" or awareness." Awareness is defined as having knowledge or understanding of something that is happening or that something exists.

Consider the things you are aware of right now. Consider the things that our culture is aware of.

When we speak of God, we speak of a God who is aware of us...and doesn't have to be.

The words of Psalm 8: 1-3 capture this: "what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them?

Yet you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet, all sheep and oxen, and also the beasts of the field, the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, whatever passes along the paths of the seas."

God is aware of us and because of this, has empathy for us. God has empathy for us when we are good. God has empathy for us when we are bad. God has empathy for us when we are successful. God has empathy for us when we are failures. Much of our Christian thought is about our right actions catching God's attention long enough, to be aware of us...to care for us...to have empathy for us.

And while God knows we need rules and regulations, laws to guide our existence, God also knows that our ultimate worth and value lies not in the perfect adherence to these.

The passage from Matthew above highlights this. It is a great struggle. We feel like we, and anyone else, should be righteous in order sit at the table and dine with Jesus. Jesus says otherwise. Jesus says he came not to heal those already well, but to have mercy on those who are sick...and friends if we live long enough, each of will fall ill (physically, spiritually and emotionally). That God is aware of us, even in our most unlovable state, is no weakness--it is the greatest show of strength and love there could be. God doesn't have to, but God always chooses us...and thanks be to God for that! -Rochelle+
