

I think its okay to say, at the outset of Holy Week 2025, that I am just tired. I am tired from the relentless nature of work and school and life in general...I am tired of the news and the current state of politics and the world...I am tired from grief and loss and the transitions of life that we are walking through. I'm just tired. Not the best way to enter this time where so much more is required of us Pastors.

In listening to my favorite podcast, Kate Bowler's Everything Happens, author and theologian Jeff Chu talks about his time at Princeton Seminary in their farminary program. What is farminary you ask (as I did)? It is a unique program that combines seminary and farming to open those called to ministry to a more connected way of learning about, experiencing God, and ministering.

When you Google Princeton and farminary, this description appears: "The harvest from the farminary's compostentiched soil is used by dining services when the seminary is in session, and during the summer the farminary offers CSA shares to the greater seminary community. The food loop includes taking scraps from dining services and composting them with autumn leaves from campus."

Part of the description from Jeff Chu's Everything Happens interview is this: in this conversation we explore "the theology of compost: how death, rot, and loss make way for new life."

I kind of don't like the death, rot and loss part (or the seasons of feeling tired), but, as Chu's interview reveals, you don't get to the good soil that nourishes and supports the harvest in the next season without the death, rot, loss (and fatigue). And so...I am learning to name it instead of denying it. I am learning to put on my muck boots and wade into it and to be in it. I am learning that there are necessary processes of these times that we all go through and rather than deny it, brush over it or stuff it down behind a smile, to just own it.

At a time when Pastor's are pushed to feel extra inspirational, coming up with the right words, the best songs, the perfect gatherings, I would like to be a little more honest. I am tired. and maybe you are too. It's okay to just stand in the garbage heap. It's okay to grieve the rot and death and loss that is integral to life. We certainly will name and embrace this truth on Good Friday. Because we can't get to Easter...we can't get to the harvest without it.

and spread the word!






Understanding Your Grief: 10 Essential Touchstones for Finding Hope and Healing in Your Heart


