"The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever else you get, get insight." -Proverbs 4:7

Insight begins with the assumption that we are on the outside of something--the outside of knowledge about something, the outside of the experience of someone else, the outside of a particular learning or skill. Insight begins with the acknowledgment that we do not know, understand or experience everything. And when we can be in that place of acknowledgment, we also will experience a bit of humility.

I spent part of my time off in Pullman, WA visiting my oldest child, Ally, who will soon graduate from WSU. I went to see her (and many of her friends) participate in SURCA (Showcase for Undergraduate Research and Creative Activities). Ally has been a part of a PhD led research project for two years investigating the inner workings of a plant essential to oil production in the food and cosmetic industry. The research, funded by a grant from the National Science Foundation, could lead to discoveries that make the farming and harvesting of this plant more efficient and sustainable. Ally recently learned that she will be listed as a co-author on this research project, which is a great honor.

Ally was one among two hundred and seventy undergraduate students presenting their hard work in so many areas of science and discovery. Walking around and hearing their many presentations on their research and discoveries gives me so much hope for the inquisitiveness and curiosity that leads to new insight and discoveries. This kind of work deserves our support and our tax-funded grant monies to push insight and discovery forward--to begin understanding that which is on the outside of our understanding, experience and knowledge.

We also stand on the outside of spiritual understanding, experience and knowledge--never fully capturing the full essence of God and God in the world and universe. In some ways, I think God meant to design it all this way so that there would always be an element of the unknown and we would never become too proud and too full of our own self-importance. As we continue through the season of Lent, may we continue to feel the hunger for knowledge, the inquisitiveness for the mysterious and the longing to know God more fully. -Rochelle+

+Attend church regularly,

+Be involved in programs and activities of the church, +Exhibit a willingness to serve,

+Contribute to the financial support of the church to the best of their ability.


## Terms of Service:

+All officers of the congregation, except Elders, shall be elected to a single one year term of office and must be reelected each June not to exceed three consecutive terms.


+Elders shall be elected to two year terms of office not to exceed two consecutive terms.

+Officers who have served three consecutive terms of office, and elders who have served two consecutive terms of office, shall be required to take one year off before being elected to the same position.
